

TOG Pre-Rhetoric Literature assignments due at Co-Op 7 on Nov. 17.

Please carefully read the entire instructions before starting the assignment.
The questions below are to be answered over the course of the next two weeks as students finish reading *By Right of Conquest*.

For the remainder of the book, beginning with Chapter 9, make observations as to the three types of settings in each chapter. Pay close attention to the setting in which the characters interact, rather than the setting about which they may be speaking.

Your answers should be in complete sentences like the examples shown below.

Chapter VIII: At Tezcucó

Physical: Roger is traveling to a great city, Tezcucó. A description of the city is found on page 124. Later, much dialog takes place in the great palace.

Temporal: The travels take place over the course of several days. Page 131 references activity while eating dinner.

Cultural: Pleasing gods through human sacrifices is part of the Aztec religion that Roger sees on his travels. The city of Tezcucó has magnificent homes for the wealthy, and the palace exhibits extraordinary splendor (p. 124-125).

In case you've forgotten, here is a reminder of the three types of settings.

Physical setting: *The environment in which the characters move and action occurs.*

Temporal Setting: *The time in which the action takes place: either a specific day or year, or an historical era.*

Cultural setting: *Includes the beliefs, attitudes, and customs that prevailed in the world at the time of the story.*
