For your assigned country, you will want to be prepared to present information on 3 different time frames: Pre-Columbian Era, Spanish Era, and Independence. Focus most of your efforts on that country's struggle for independence. You'll want to include information on people groups and political structure/power/leaders (not natural features and resources). Please prepare 3, 8.5 x 11 sheets – typed or handwritten in large script – as visual aids for your presentation. Below is a sample of how this would look if you were doing the United States:
