### Literature Assignment

- Read *David Copperfield*, retold by Clare West. Answer the attached SAP questions. Your answers may be typed, written on blank paper or NEATLY recorded on the SAP itself.
- For chapters 1-5, pause after each chapter to answer the questions on SAP 13 in complete sentences.
- Answer the questions on SAP 14 in complete sentences
  
- Memorize the definitions for **suspense**, **pun**, **flashback** and **foreshadowing**. Be sure to continue to review the previous definitions that you've memorized since they are all quiz-able in class. ### Geography Assignment

Please review with your student:

Central America is generally considered part of the continent of North America, but is often referred to as its own region. Central America is a narrow isthmus that is bordered by North America and the Gulf of Mexico to the north and by South America to the south. The Caribbean Islands are another region that are considered part of the continent of North America. They are located in the Caribbean Sea to the east of Central America. - In class we used the pneumonic **Many Guatemalan Boys Eat Honeycomb Not Cocoa Puffs** in order to learn the order of the countries (Mexico, Guatemala, Belize, El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua, Costa Rica & Panama).
- For the first week, each day either trace or use a dry erase pen to label Mexico and all of the Central American countries, plus Cuba, Haiti, Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico and Jamaica. Learn to spell the countries correctly. For the second week, practice blobbing Mexico, and the Central American countries and islands.
- At our next co-op students will be asked to blob and label Mexico and Central America from memory. Don't forget to pay special attention to where and how the Central American countries join North America and South America. As discussed in class, drawings should include a small amount of South America and North America in order to show the relationships between the countries and islands to these continents.
