Memorize the definitions for these literature terms (three terms are new and two previous terms from last semester have expanded definitions).

- **Exposition:** a literary device used to introduce background information about events, settings, characters, or other elements of a work to the reader.
- **Rising action:** a series of relevant incidents that create suspense, interest, and tension in a narrative.
- **Climax:** a very exciting section of the story where the main conflict or crisis reaches its peak
- **Falling Action:** occurs right after the climax, when the main problem of the story resolves
- **Resolution (Denouement):** how the story ends usually involving the solution of a complicated issue in a story.

Read *The Jungle Book* by Rudyard Kipling

Complete SAP 29 after reading “Tiger! Tiger!” and “The White Seal.”

Complete SAP 30 after reading “Rikki-Tikki-Tavi,” “Toomai of the Elephants” and “Servants of the Queen.”
