Hit with force when moving

Submerge:

To submerge

Fatal:

*Leading to failure or disaster;
causing death*

Assault:

A Physical attack

Casualty:

*A person killed or injured in a war
or accident*

Wail:

Noun: a prolonged high-pitched
cry of pain, grief or anger
Verb: give a cry of pain, grief or
anger

Despair:

The complete loss or absence of hope

Prestigious:

Inspiring respect and admiration; having high status

Depict:

Show or represent by a drawing, painting, or other art form

Awe:

A feeling of reverential respect mixed with fear or wonder

Deftly:

In a way that is neatly skillful and quick in movement

Palatable:

(of food or drink) Pleasant to taste

Fastidious:

Very attentive to and concerned about accuracy and detail

Suffrage:

The right to vote in political elections

Perilous:

Full of danger or risk

Endeavor:

Try hard to do or achieve something

Radiant:

Sending out light; shining or glowing brightly

Furlorn:

Pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely; hopeless

Fetid:

Smelling extremely unpleasant

Jovial:

Cheerful and friendly

Legacy:

An amount of money or property left to someone in a will; a heritage

Bold:

Showing an ability to take risks; confident and courageous

Having a strong or vivid appearance

Contemplate:

Look thoughtfully for a long time at; think about

Revere:

Feel deep respect or admiration for something

Sage:

A profoundly wise man, especially one who features in ancient history or legend

Falter:

Start to lose strength or momentum; speak in a hesitant or unsteady voice; move unsteadily

Elaborate:

Involving many carefully arranged parts or details; (of an action) lengthy and exaggerated

Gravity:

Extreme or alarming importance; seriousness; solemnity of manner

Appalled:

Greatly dismay or horrify

Audacious:

Showing a willingness to take surprisingly bold risks; showing an impudent lack of respect

Resolve:

Settle or find a solution to a problem; decide firmly on a course of action

Warily:

Cautiously; carefully; in a way that shows lack of trust; suspiciously

Trepidation:

A feeling of fear or agitation about something that may happen; trembling motion

Prominent:

Important; famous; situated so as to catch attention; noticeable

Inevitable:

Certain to happen; unavoidable

Provoke:

Stimulate or give rise to (a reaction or emotion, typically a strong or unwelcome one) in someone

Stimulate or incite (someone); deliberately make someone annoyed or angry

Amiable:

Having or displaying a friendly and pleasant manner

Exemplary:

Serving as a desirable model; representing the best of its kind

Zealous:

Having or showing zeal

Placid:

(Of a person or animal) not easily upset or excited

(Of a place) calm and peaceful

Gravely:

To a degree that gives cause for alarm; in a serious or solemn manner

Reverie:

A state of being pleasantly lost in one's thoughts: a daydream

Solemn:

Not cheerful or smiling; serious; characterized by deep sincerity

Destined:

Certain to meet (a particular fate); intended for or traveling toward a particular place; preordained

Laden:

Heavily loaded or weighed down

Transfixed:

Cause someone to become motionless with honor, wonder, or astonishment

Hostile:

Unfriendly; antagonistic

Of belonging to a military enemy; opposed

Obscure:

Uncertain; not clearly expressed or easily understood; not important or well known

Hastily:

With excessive speed or urgency; hurriedly

Serene:

Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil

Grandiose:

Impressive or magnificent in appearance or style; excessively grand or ambitious

Fatigued:

Cause someone to feel tired or exhausted; to weaken
