TIMELINE EVENTS: In Pink: **1775**-Daniel Boone in Kentucky; **1777-1787**-America ruled by the Articles of Confederation; **1786**-Shay's Rebellion; **1787**-US Constitution completed; **1789**-George Washington becomes the first president; **1791**-Constitution and Bill of Rights Ratified

In Red: 1788: Louis XVI Convenes the Estates General; **1789**-France holds elections; **1789**-Storming of the Bastille; **1793**-Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette are executed; **1789-1799**-French Revolution; **1793-1794**-Reign of Terror; **1795-1799**-The Directory rules France; **1799**-Napoleon seizes power
